We would instinctively imagine that similar buildings do not exist anymore, but is this true? Do Wonders still exist? Are human beings still building this kind of thing?

In 2019, 50 million people attended the Kumbh Mela in the Indian cities of Allahabad Haridwar, Ujiain and Nashik; dedicated temporary cities were built specifically for them. Every year, at the end of the mourning period of Ashura, 25 million Shia pilgrims walk Najof to Karbala. Temporary installations are built all along the road. A new roof for the shrine of Imam Husayn was completed in 2017. Nearly 20 colossal statues have been completed (or are under construction) in the last 20 years. Every year about 100,000 people meet in the Black Rock desert in Nevada (USA) to build a temporary city for "Ruming Man," How do we look at these places? What sort of theory do they require? What can we discover by going there? What kind of grahitecture can we impaine after
