


Our 17 March 2023 session focuses on new students and those who are currently writing their thesis/dissertation proposal in preparation for their Proposal Defence.

#### Faculty of Creative Arts | Visual Art Studies Engaging Arts & Humanities Series



As a curator I'm often thinking about how galleries and museums, as civic and secular institutions like the Art Gallery of New South Wales can recover ceremony, ritual and sacredness within definitions of the art of today. In some cases, it has been argued that objects made by artists for practical or ritual purposes do not abide by the same criteria used to evaluate contemporty art. Others have argued that the display of art tied to tradition and belief is relieved of its criticality and political agency when removed from its socio-political context.

Looking at objects in the Art Gallery collection made by Indigenous people from the Cordillera Mountain range in Northern Luzon, Philippines, this lecture discusses what it means to recover ritual in gallery contexts and how contemporary artists can be part of that recovery.

Recovering Ritual in Museums & Galleries with a focus on the Philippines with Dr. Matt Cox

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Dr. Matt Cox completed a BA in Asian Studies with a major in Indonesian Studies (UNSW), MA in Art History (USY0 and a Doctoral Heals The Javanese Bell in Portroliner from 1880 to 1255 (USYD). Cox has taight subjects on Contemporary art at the University of Sydney and is curator of Asian Art at the Art Gallery of New South Wales. As a curator he is brandly engaged with historical and contemporary art mon Australia and the world.

He recently curated Position and procession. Art of the Philippins (2017): Piophost: Dabell Australian Drawing Biennale 2018; Wolking with goals (2019). A promise: Kheled Sabasili (2020) and The National / 2022): New Australian Art. Integral to these exhibitions and his curatorial practice more generally is his work with artists, curaters and academics in Australia and Asia to explore relationships between art history and living communities.



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
